### Requirements for a Master's Degree:

1) To be awarded a Master's degree, a student is required to earn a minimum of 30 credits including at least 16 credits from lecture subjects, complete a Master's thesis acceptable to the GSID and pass an oral examination.

2) In order to earn a Master's degree, the student is also required to satisfy the requirements determined by the program in which she/he is enrolled as a major field of specialization. However, in special circumstances approved by the program director, other subjects may be substituted for the program's required subjects.

### Requirements for certifying completion of Program in Economic Development Policy and Management as a major field of specialization:

1) In order to complete this program as the major field of specialization, a student must earn a minimum of 16 credits, of which 8 credits are from the program's 4 required subjects, 4 credits from the program's core seminar subjects, and the other 4 credits from the program's core elective subjects.

2) In addition, the student must earn 10 credits from GSID common subjects, including two mandatory subjects, Introduction to International Development and Japan's Development Experience.

3) If approved by her/his academic advisor, the student is allowed to earn up to 10 credits from other graduate schools within Nagoya University, and/or from graduate schools of other universities with which GSID has signed academic credit-exchange agreements.

### Requirements for certifying the completion of Program in Economic Development Policy and Management chosen as a minor field of specialization:

In order to complete this program as a minor field of specialization, in addition to his/her chosen major, a student must earn 8 credits by completing all of the program's required core lecture subjects.

#### Notes:

\* Students who have previously taken a required subject may be exempted from taking it upon successful completion of an exam.

\* Topics in international economics are covered in the subjects Development Macroeconomics, Development Microeconomics, Macro Economics, Economic Development Management under Globalization, and Development Finance.

\* Intensive courses on various methods of quantitative analysis (e.g. EViews and CGE) are offered as Special Lectures on Economic Development Policy and Management I & II.
