Application Procedure for the Research Student Program

October 2021 Admission

The Graduate School of International Development (GSID) at Nagoya University is accepting applications from international students (non-Japanese citizens who can obtain the residential status of “college student”) who wish to study as research students starting in October 2021.

To apply, please read the following information carefully and submit application forms and other required documents in full and on time.

1. QUALIFICATIONS

You are eligible to apply if you:

- (1) Have a bachelor's degree from a recognized university, and
- (2) Acquire a minimum score on one of the following (a)-(e) English proficiency tests. The test should have been taken within five years prior to the date of the first day of the application period of the Research Student Program October 2021 Admission.*
 - (a) TOEFL-iBT: 79 or more
 - (b) TOEFL-PBT: 550 or more
 - (c) TOEIC (Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking Tests): total 1600 or more (Writing and Speaking scores should be multiplied by 2.5)
 - (d) IELTS: 6.0 or more (and should include Academic Reading and Academic Writing)
 - (e) Duolingo: 100 (<https://englishtest.duolingo.com/applicants>)*

*Acceptance of a Duolingo score and score from a test taken within the past five years will apply only to the application for October 2021 Admission.

2. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED

(1) Application Form

- (a) Please use the attached form.
- (b) Fill in all the required fields as directed.

(2) Letter of Recommendation

- (a) You must request a letter of recommendation from your most recent university, to be issued by the President, Dean or your academic supervisor, and to be written on university letterhead.
- (b) The issuer must provide an e-mail address so that we can contact him/her.
- (c) The issuer can send the letter directly to the Dean, GSID. In that case, the issuer must write “*Recommendation letter for research student program application*” on the front of the

envelope. Applicants can also submit the letter of recommendation together with other documents but the envelope of the recommendation letter must be sealed by the issuer.

(3) Certificates/Proof of Graduation

You must submit certificates/proof of graduation for ALL your university level education. If you are planning to graduate from university by the end of September 2021, please submit a certificate to that effect. Please submit documents which show acquisition of your bachelor's degree.

(4) Certificate of Academic Record/Transcript

You must submit academic records/transcripts for ALL your university level education.

(5) Research Proposal

Your research proposal must be in English.

It should be approximately 800 words.

(6) Certificate of Residence (*Juminhyo*) (for those already residing in Japan), issued after 1 April 2021

Only submit this if you live in Japan. It must be obtained from the local government office of the area where you are registered *after 1 April 2021*. Please note this is NOT required for applicants who live overseas.

(7) Photocopy of Residence Card

For those who live in Japan, submit a photocopy of your Residence Card (both front and back).

(8) Certificate of English language proficiency

This may be a photocopy of a TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS or Duolingo certificate.

Any certificates other than for these tests are not accepted.

(9) Documents which show the ability to finance yourself

Please submit one of the following documents:

- (a) Certificate of bank account balance under your name; or
- (b) Certificate of scholarship awarded to you; or
- (c) Letter written by your sponsor (including your parents) guaranteeing to finance you, with the sponsor's certificate of bank account balance; or
- (d) Other relevant documents which show your ability to finance yourself.

(10) A photocopy of the photo and signature page of your passport

Please submit this if you have a passport.

(11) Photograph

Please submit two photos (Size 4.0 cm X 3.0 cm), one of which should be attached to the application form.

(12) Summary of your Master's thesis

Please submit this if you are interested in applying for the Doctoral program at GSID after the completion of the research-student program.

Note:

- * All documents must be ORIGINAL unless otherwise stated. Please submit an official photocopy if you cannot submit the original document.*
- * Certified translation is required if documents are NOT in either JAPANESE or ENGLISH.*
- * In the screening process, the applicant may be asked to submit required documents in an electronic form.*

3. SUBMISSION PERIOD AND POSTAL ADDRESS

(1) Your application forms and all documents must arrive within the submission period of
19 April 2021 (Monday) to 23 April 2021 (Friday) (no exceptions).

(3) Method of Submission

- * Applications should be sent by REGISTERED MAIL or another means that can confirm delivery status (such as EMS). Submissions other than by post will not be accepted.
(Friends or relatives of the applicant must not submit the application on behalf of the applicant.)*
- * Please write "Application for Research Student Program" on the front of the envelope.*
- * A letter of recommendation sent directly to the Dean of GSID must arrive during the submission period.*
- * Required documents must be put in the same order as they appear in the application procedure.*

Note:

- * Application documents once submitted cannot be returned to the applicant under any circumstances.*
- * Applications received after the deadline will not be accepted under any circumstances.*
- * No application will be accepted unless all the documents mentioned above are fully and correctly completed.*

* Note that any documents not requested under "Documents to be Submitted" that are included in the submission will not be considered for review, nor returned under any circumstances.

4. APPLICATION SCREENING PROCESS

- (1) The application screening process has two stages: *preliminary screening* and *final screening*. Inquiries regarding the process, including acceptance of application, cannot be answered.
- (2) Preliminary screening will be finalized approximately two months after the end of the application period. Results of the preliminary screening will be informed to all applicants.
- (3) Results of final screening will also be informed to all applicants successful in the preliminary screening. Successful applicants will receive an official "Certificate of Admission."

5. EXAMINATION FEE

- (1) You do NOT need to pay any examination fee when you submit your application.
- (2) ***Only applicants who pass the preliminary screening are required to pay the examination fee of JPY9,800.*** Directions for paying the fee will be included with the notification of the result of the preliminary screening. **Payment of the fee is a requirement for final screening.**
- (3) Please note that paid fees will not be refunded under any circumstances, and that the amount is subject to change without prior notice.

- (3) If you are accepted as a research student, you must pay a registration fee of JPY84,600 upon entrance. Tuition is JPY29,700 per month, and research students are required to pay the monthly tuition fee for six months (JPY178,200) in advance. This means that a total of JPY262,800 must be paid upon entrance.
- (4) It is possible that you will not be allowed to enter Japan due to measures for the prevention of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). If this is the case, please contact the abovementioned International Student Services.
