## **Admission Policy**

The Special Program for Global Business Professionals is intended for a small number of early- and mid-career business professionals and government officials. It aims to educate global business professionals who have holistic perspectives on business operations in developing and emerging countries by helping them to acquire knowledge and communication skills, as well as to construct human networks that are beneficial for such business operations. This program provides early- and mid-career business professionals with graduate-level education covering various fields of studies, including the political, socioeconomic and legal frameworks of developing countries, human resources and industry development, and international law concerning multinational corporations.

In light of the above aims, this program seeks candidates with a basic foundation in a specific field of international development cooperation who meet the following criteria:

- (1) Business professionals who engage or are expected to engage in business operations in developing and emerging countries, or government officials who are engaged or expected to be engaged in matters concerning international development or international cooperation as well as public-private partnerships, including cooperation with business and private sectors; and
- (2) Persons who have work experience of more than three years.

### Information on Application for the GSID Master's Program

### (Special Program for Global Business Professionals)

for the Academic Year 2020

#### 1. Application Requirements

Those who have work experience of three years in private corporations, governmental offices etc.; those who can obtain a recommendation for enrollment in this program from their affiliated organization; those who will belong to the affiliated organization throughout the period of attendance in this program; and those who meet one of the following qualifications are eligible to apply.

- (1) Have graduated from an accredited Japanese university or will graduate by the end of March, 2020
- (2) Have been conferred a Bachelor's degree according to Article 104(4-1) of the School Education Law or will be conferred a Bachelor's degree by the end of March, 2020.
- (3) Have completed at least 16 years of formal education in their home country or will have completed 16 years of formal education by the end of March, 2020.
- (4) Have completed up to 16 years of formal education in Japan through correspondence education managed by a foreign school or another recognized educational institution or will complete 16 years of formal education by the end of March, 2020.
- (5) Have graduated from a university in Japan that is a recognized university belonging to the system of higher education of a foreign country and is approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (only those who have completed at least 16 years of formal education) or will graduate by the end of March, 2020.
- (6) Persons who have been conferred, or expect to be conferred by the end of March, 2020, a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree through attending an overseas university or other overseas school (limited to those whose education and research activities have been evaluated by persons who have been certified by the relevant country's government or a related institution, or have been separately designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as being equivalent to such) and graduated from a program that requires three or more years to complete (includes graduating from a program implemented by the relevant overseas school while living in Japan through distance learning, as well as graduating from a program implemented by an educational facility established with the relevant overseas country's school education system and has received the designation mentioned above).
- (7) Have graduated from a Post-secondary Course of a Specialized Training College recognized by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (limited to applicants who have attended for at least 4 years, and to those who have fulfilled requirements as approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology), or will complete their degree by the end of March, 2020.
- (8) Have been approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Ministry Notice No. 5 of 1953).
- (9) Have been recognized by GSID as those who were on the register at an accredited Japanese university for no less than 3 years or completed at least 15 years of formal education in their home country and received necessary units of credit with good grades or graduated from a university in Japan that is a recognized university belonging to the system of higher education of a foreign country and is approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (only those who have completed at least 15 years of formal education) or expected to do so by the end of March, 2020.
- (10) Have been recognized by GSID based on individual screening of qualifications as being comparable in academic ability to a Japanese university graduate, and of an age not less than 22 by the end of March, 2020.

#### 2. Admission Openings

#### 3. Filing Period

Applications will be accepted from 9:00 to 16:00 during the periods from <u>December 2</u> (<u>Monday</u>), 2019 to <u>December 13</u> (<u>Friday</u>), 2019 at the GSID Administrative Office, the Student Affairs Division for the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences, GSID Administrative Office. For those sending applications by registered mail, applications MUST reach the office by <u>16:00 on December 13</u> (<u>Friday</u>), 2019. Any applications received after this date and time will not be considered for processing.

#### 4. Required Documents

The following documents should be submitted to the GSID Administrative Office, Student Affairs Division for the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences.

- (1) Application Form\* (Form provided)
- (2) Curriculum Vitae/Resume\* (Form provided)
- (3) Statement of purpose and research proposal (Please use A4 sized paper, and write or type your statement of purpose and research proposal in 1,200 words or less in English or 3,000 characters or less in Japanese. Clearly specify the title of your research topic.)

Also, send an electronic file (PDF or MSWord) of Statement of Purpose and Research Proposal to gsidexam@adm.nagoya-u.ac.jp. Please write your name in the subject line.

- (4) Statement concerning applicant's working and/or research experience
- (5) Photograph Card\*, Examinee's Registration Card\* and Receipt Forms\*: Attach photo (4cm×5cm) taken within the last 3 months. Please write your name on the two Receipt Forms. (Forms provided)
- (6) Self-addressed Envelopes\*: Please use the two envelopes provided, with stamps worth 372 yen attached to each. If Japanese stamps are not available, please send instead 6 International Return Coupons which are available at post offices.
- (7) Contact Address Labels\*: Please fill out these forms, marked あて名シール\*, with your contact address. (Labels provided)
- (8) Letter of Recommendation: Must be written and sealed by the applicant's supervisor, employer or equivalent person at the affiliated organization.
- (9) Official academic transcripts from each school, university, or professional school attended after graduating from high school, whether or not a degree was awarded. Photocopies will not be accepted.
- (10) Certificate of Graduation, or Certificate of Prospective Graduation issued by your present university. Photocopies will not be accepted.
- (11) Applicants without Japanese nationality must submit a photocopy of the page of their valid passport showing the passport number and the applicant's photograph. Those applicants who are currently residing in Japan must also submit a photocopy of Alien Registration Card or Residence Card (both sides).
- (12) A photocopy of certificate of English language proficiency. The applicants should submit a photocopy of their official score sheet of TOEFL, TOEIC or IELTS taken within two years prior to the application. An official test score sheet must include an ID photo. Institutional test scores are not acceptable.
- (13) A promissory letter that the applicant will not leave the affiliated organization during the period of attendance in the program (no specific format required).

If you are an employee of an organization, you are requested to submit a letter of consent from the head of your organization after you passed the examination.

#### 5. Application Procedures

(1) Please procure the application forms, which are sent by mail. - (2) Items (1)-(13) should be completed and submitted to the GSID Administrative Office, Student Affairs Division for the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences. In addition to these documents an examination fee of 30,000 yen is required (non-refundable). In Japan, please use a Japanese Postal Money Order but DO NOT fill in anything.
- (3) If items (9) and (10) are sent directly from your home university, please make sure that those items reach the GSID Administrative Office, Student Affairs Division for the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences during the filing period.
- (4) For those who fall under category (9) or (10) in the Application Requirements, the following paper work MUST reach the GSID Administrative Office, Student Affairs Division for the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences by November 12(Tuesday), 2019 in order to receive the Eligibility Screening for the Examination. Results of the Eligibility Screening for the Examination will be sent to applicants by November 29 Friday), 2018.

- ④ Official academic transcripts from each school, university, or professional school attended after graduating from high school, whether or not a degree was awarded. Photocopies will not be accepted.
- ⑤ Certificate of Graduation, Certificate of Prospective Graduation, or its equivalent (for example, certificate of employment or certificate of registration at academic institutions). Photocopies will not be accepted.
- 6 Statement concerning applicant's working and/or research experience.
- \* Regarding the procurement of such Forms as 1 and 2, please refer to 5. (1) of this *Application Guidebook*.

Those who have passed the Eligibility Screening for the Examination must send items (1), (5)-(8), and (11)-(13) as specified in the Required Documents section as well as the examination fee of 30,000 yen (non-refundable).

Note: Applicants who hold (or expected to hold) three-year bachelor's degree and/or applicants whose total period of primary, secondary and higher education is less than 16 years are required to pass the Eligibility Screening for the Examination.

#### 6. Selection Process, Date and Location

The assessment consists of the screening of application materials and an oral examination.

Oral Examination

(1) Date and Time: January 31 (Friday), 2020, from 10:00

(Applicants shall register between 9:30 and 9:50)

(2) Location: Nagoya University Higashiyama Campus (Details will be sent with Examinee's Registration Card.)

#### 7. Final Announcement of Examination Results

(1) Date: February 12 (Wednesday), 2020 around 14:00. No telephone inquiries will be accepted.

- (2) Location: Entrance Hall of the GSID building.
- (3) Notification: Official letters of admission will be sent out by mail after the announcement.

#### 8. Entrance Registration Procedures

Detailed information regarding additional paperwork for admission and entrance registration will be sent in early March.

- (1) Registration Days: March 26(Thursday) to March 27(Friday), 2020
- (2) Required Fees:
  - ① Entrance Fee: 282,000 yen
  - 2 Tuition Fee (6 months: April 2020-September 2020): 267,900 yen (535,800 yen per year)
  - \*1 Those who have already enrolled in other universities are, in principle, unable to enroll in GSID. However, under certain circumstances, there may be cases of acceptance. Please contact the GSID Administrative Office, Student Affairs Division for the School of Humanities and Social Sciences before undertaking entrance registration procedures.
  - \*2 Please note that if the fees change before your entrance to the university or during your stay at Nagova University, you need to pay the revised fees.

#### 9. Applicants with Special Needs

A photocopy of the diagnosis may be accepted. Furthermore, please submit other requested documents if necessary.

- (2) After applications are filed, no changes in submitted documents are permitted. The examination fee of 30,000 yea is non-refundable. Submitted documents will not be returned.
