Title: The Rise and Fall of the Mexican Education Reform: 2013–2019

Carlos Ornelas is a professor of Education and Communications at the Universidad Autónoma Metropolitana (UAM) Xochimilco Campus in Mexico City.

His teaching experience includes being a Visiting Professor at Hiroshima University (2014); Visiting Professor of Comparative Education at Teacher College Columbia University (2008-2009), and Visiting Lecturer and Fulbright Scholar at Harvard University Graduate School of Education (1987). Presently: Visiting Professor at the Graduate School of International Development at Nagoya University.

He earned a Ph.D. in Education from Stanford University in 1980.

He is the author of five books as a single author, editor of nine other books, 82 referred articles in professional journals and edited books. Also, he authored 83 reviews, extended essay reviews, and other professional papers. He writes two columns per week in *Excélsior*, a Mexican national newspaper.
